Good communication skills are essential in helping parents and caregivers make decisions about sharing their strengths, concerns, priorities, and resources about their family life. In this session, we will discuss home visitation strategies to engage parents in conversations about the aspects of their family life that are important to both their child's development and their interactions with their children.
